## Monitoring and Evaluation of Integrating Climate Change Mitigation and Adaptation

Monitoring and Evaluation is key in keeping track of the progress made with Climate Change Mitigation and Adaptation plans. To do this indicator are chosen to monitor and evaluate the performance of the Department (DOCC<sup>1</sup>) Business Plans and project. The monitoring component usually is made up of continuous checks on the progress made through the collection and analysis of data from the department and projects cycle. It is an essential part of any CCDRR activities, implementations and provides constant feedback on implementation and progress made towards the Department of Climate Change goals and objectives. The evaluation component consists of regular assessment of the outputs being achieved by the programme. Evaluation of the business plan activities determines whether the outputs are being achieved in a timely manner, whether it is being efficient, effective and having an impact on the overall objective of the Department and projects. Monitoring and Evaluation provides Directors, staffs and programme/ project managers with the required information to be able to make corrections alignment with the strategic plans and project design when and if needed; making it essential to the department for

sustainably.

With respect to the Vanuatu, there is a lack of resources related to the monitoring and evaluation component of Mitigation and Adaptation implementation. However, there are key documents such as NAPA<sup>2</sup>, CCDRR Policy<sup>3</sup>, NSDP<sup>4</sup>, FRDP and National Framework of monitoring and Evaluation that have been produced to guide such developments such as the Regional Action Plan and the Pacific Waste Water Framework for Action. Both these documents were produced to help develop better water resource management in the Pacific and as is a road map for Pacific water needs.





### Reporting Structure




Staffs and project Staffs are to report to M&E officer while M&E officer and Director finalize the report and submit to executive officer to make further submissions.
