# Monitoring Vs. Evaluation

- Systematic, <u>ongoing</u>
- During programme implementation
- <u>Tracking</u> of activities and progress
- According to Business Plan
- For short term corrective action
- Accountability for implementation
- Contributes to evaluation
- Conducted by insiders
  - Are we doing things right?

- Systematic, periodic
- During <u>and</u> after programme implementation
- <u>Judgment</u> of merit, value or worth of a programme/project
- Compared to <u>evaluation criteria</u> (relevance, effectiveness, impact)
- For decision-making about future programmes
- Accountability for results
- For office & organizational learning
- Conducted by <u>impartial outsiders</u>
  - Did we do the rights things?

# Monitoring

- **Track progress towards the agreed results** in the Business Plan, Ministry Corporate Plan, NSDP....
- Checks if <u>assumptions made and risks identified</u> at the design stage are still valid or need to be reviewed
  - Allows DoCC/NABs and implementing partners to make <u>mid-term review</u> as an integral part of programme management.

### And Why Do We Need It?

- DoCC/Nabs is responsible, with partners, to monitor achievement of results
- Regular and systematic **assessment of progress**
- Continued review of <u>partners' capacity development</u> <u>needs</u>
- Improve <u>results-based reporting</u> on achievements
  - Strengthen <u>teamwork and ownership</u> of the Department among implementing partners
- Feeds into <u>evaluation and real-time</u>, evidence-based decision making

# What is Evaluation?

- Systematic, impartial assessment
- **External**, separated from programme management
- Determines whether results made a <u>worthwhile contribution</u> to national development priorities
  - Criteria: relevance, efficiency, effectiveness, impact, sustainability

### 3 key functions:

- Programme improvement
- → Accountability
- Organisational learning

## And why do we need to do it?

Whether we are Doing the Right Things
-Relevance/rationale/justification
-Client satisfaction

Whether we are <u>Doing it Right</u>
Effectiveness/coherence
Efficiency: optimizing resources
Sustainability
Impact

Whether there are <u>Better Ways of Doing it</u> -Alternatives

- -Good practices
- -Lessons learned

-Improved positioning to influence next development planning framework



### **M&E Questions**

- Monitoring questions
- What is being done?
- By whom?
- Target population?
- When?
- How much?
- How often?
- Additional outputs?
- Resources used? (Staff, funds, materials, etc.)



**Evaluation Questions?** 

- Is the content of the implementation or the activity being delivered as planned?
- Does the content of the activity reflect the expected standards?
- Have the implementation achieved the expected results?



# M&E System: Tools

- Results Matrix
- M&E Plan
- Reliable data systems
- Single Progress Report per Month cycle
- Quarterly-SMR-Annual Review [and report]
  - Input/Process (Monitoring)
  - Outcome / Impact (Evaluation)
